**Maternal health :**

- ANC Registration Reported in HMIS in the month of April to March against estimated is 72% . According to AHS it is 68.2% which considerably better value.
- Percentage of 3 ANC checkups reported in HMIS (52%) as compared to AHS data (25.6%) is high which raises an issue of over reporting. Data needs to be verified. MCTS service updation of 3 ANC is also very poor (41% ), need to be keep on priority..
- According to AHS Home delivery in district is 39%, whereas only 8% home deliveries are being reported, this shows reporting gap. If this gap is covered around 30% missing deliveries can be covered.

**Child Health:**

- Percentage Newborn weight at birth reported by district is 93% where as in AHS it is 32.5% , difference is more than double which is suggestive of over reporting. Similarly, percentage LBW reported is 6% and according to AHS is 18% which is less than half of it indicative of underreporting. Need to flag the issue and verify the records.

**Immunization**

- Full Immunization status in MCTS is little bit better which is 61% where as district is reporting 59% in HMIS.
- HepB0 reporting is very low in Aaspurdavsra, Sangipur,Kalakakar and Laxmanpur blocks.

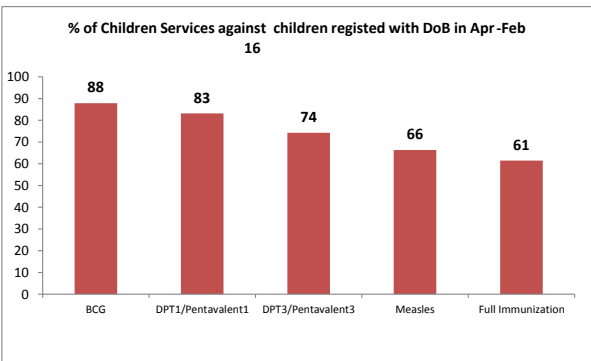
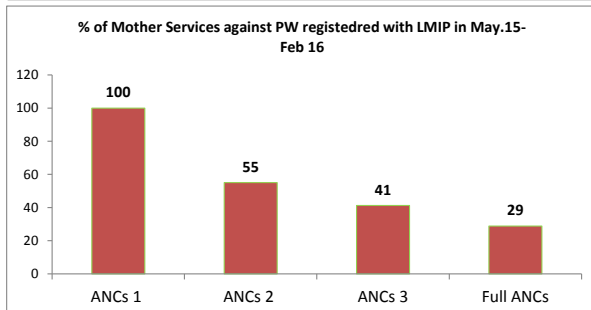
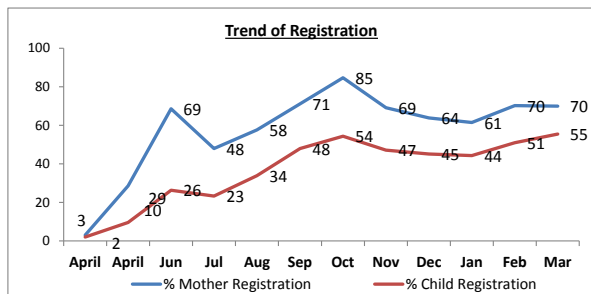

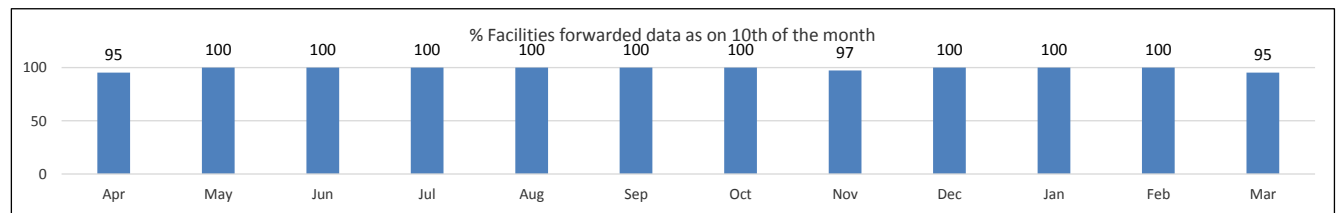
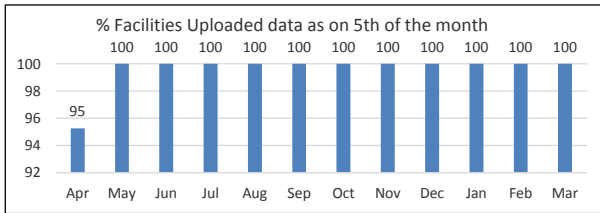
- Child registration is very low in MCTS and if compare with HMIS it's similarly 55%.

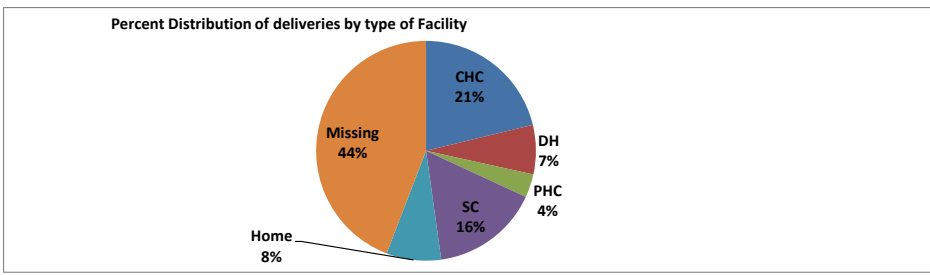
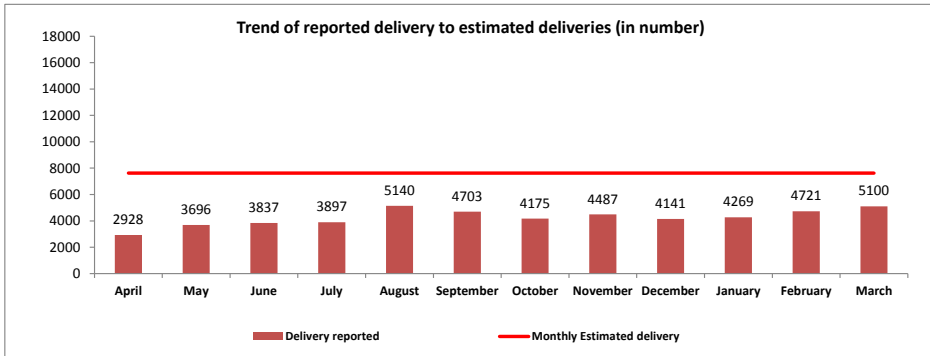
**Gaps in ANC Registration :**

1. ANC registration is 72% and although AHS 2012-13 showing ANC registration 68.2%. It's Near by from AHS data.
- 2- ANC Registration in 1st trim. is 54% which is reported approx equal to AHS 12-13(58.4). Lalganj, Kalakaker and Mandhata blocks are reported <35% in 1st trimester registration.
- 3- % of ANC received 3 ANC checkup is 52% which is more reported from AHS 12-13(25.6%).





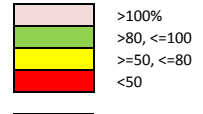

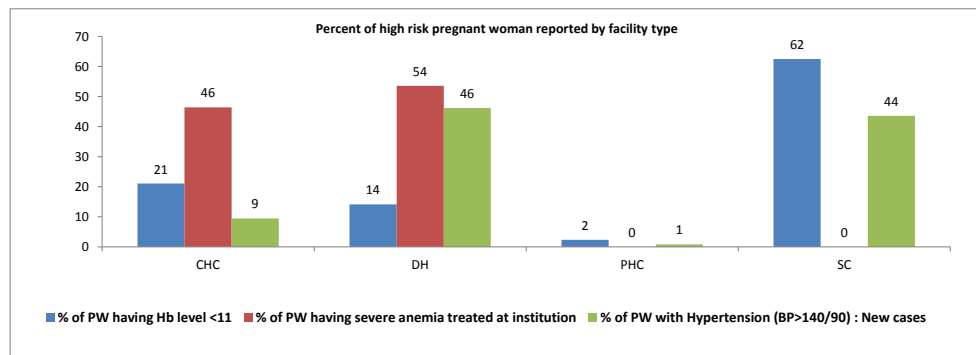
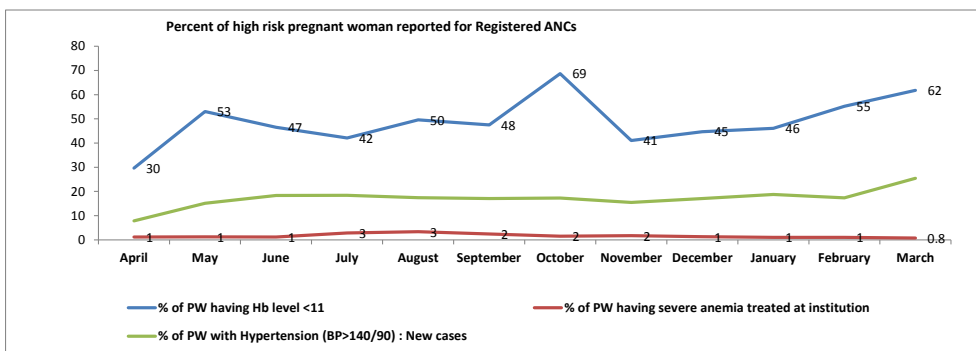
- 1- Percentage of institutional delivery is 86% while AHS data shows 58.9%, which needs to check.
- 2- Percentage of delivered women discharged within 48 hours is 81 percent while according to AHS data it is 88.1 percent. Data near by AHS data.
- 3- Distribution of delivery across facility is almost similar figure i.e. CHC 21%, PHC 4%, SC 16% respectively, which is against the guidelines. This data needs to verify from base records .
- 4- % of JSY incentive paid to mothers in Sadar and Laxmanpur is very less in this month. Patti and kunda Blocks reported more than 100%.

- 2- 93% births are reported as newborns weighed at birth of births, while AHS shows 32.5 %, attracting much attention for policy makers.
- 3- Only 6% of newborn having <2.5 k.g are reported, while AHS shows 18.2 % which is need to check and verify.
- 4- 96% of newborns breast fed within 1 hour are reported, while AHS shows 39.4% which is need to check and verify.

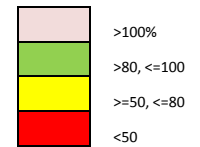

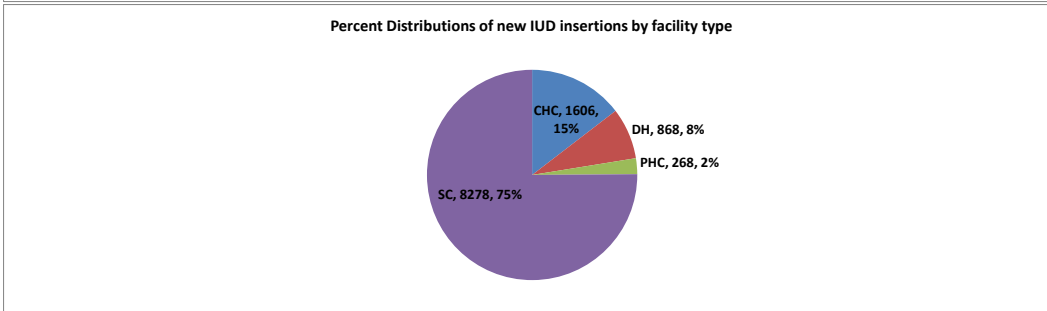
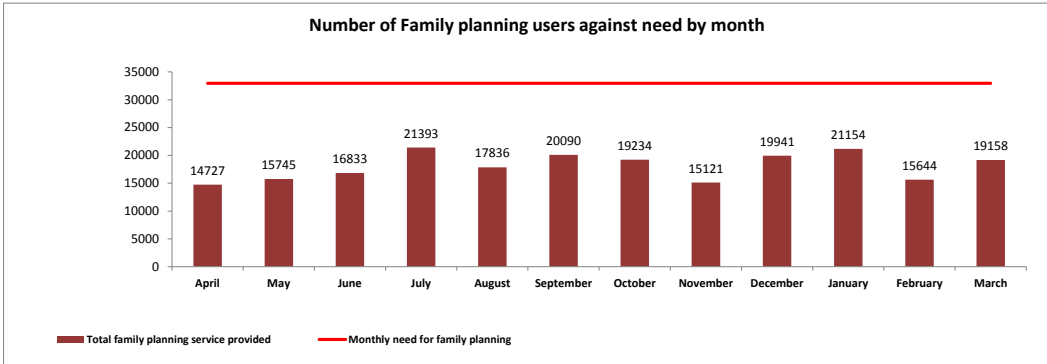

- 1- No of Live births and BCG given not corresponding in most of the blocks. Data needs to verify from records available at facility.
- 2- Usually BCG, OPV0 and Hepatitis B0 doses are given at birth time but data shows that all three are not given at the time of birth even at DH and CHCs, it is showing service gap at facility and need focus monitoring.
- 3- Gaura, Shivgarh and Mandhata blocks are reporting <50% of full immunization. Sadar reporting more than 100% which is need to verify the data.



Pratapgarh - Family Planning Services Reported in HMIS during FY 2016-17 (Up to Mar)

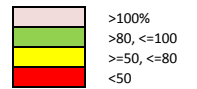

Gaps in Family planning :

- 1- IUD insertion is only 15% at CHC, while 8% in DH. Major contribution is from SC 75%.
- 2- 82% blocks are poor in spacing methods so it should improve data in spacing method.
